



Date: March 4, 2024 Regarding: Closing of MCMI and Discontinued School Access to Concussion Testing Materials

Dear current and past members,

This letter is official notice that after 15 years the Maine Concussion Management Initiative will cease operations on June 1, 2024. We have reached our goal of improving the identification and management of childhood concussions in Maine, and while work remains to be done, major steps toward improving concussion management have been accomplished. It is now time for others to continue the work of improving the safety of youth sports and identifying ways to improve the outcomes for children who sustain a concussion.

Below, we will address how MCMI's closure might affect your school's concussion management practices (i.e., concussion testing options, HIT website, and concussion education resources).

Concussion Testing Options for Next Year

MCMI will no longer coordinate or administer concussion testing for schools, but we are able to provide information about how to set up your school's own, independent testing accounts and procedures to start preparticipation assessments this summer (summer 2024).

MCMI has contacted two companies (ImPACT and SWAY) and confirmed that current (2023-2024) MCMI members are eligible for discounted pricing. The quoted prices provided by the companies as well as contact information for representatives of each company are listed below. The companies are listed in alphabetical order, and we encourage you to review each company's testing platform and pricing to make the best selection for your school. Please note, these two companies are not the only options available for concussion testing. MCMI has worked with these two companies but listing them here should not be taken as an endorsement.

Head Injury Tracking (HIT) Website

If you used MCMI's HIT website to document and track concussion occurrences for reporting to the Maine Department of Education, your school will need to develop an alternative injury-tracking procedure and report directly to Emily Poland at the end of each school year. These changes will take effect starting after June 1. Any data reported to the HIT Website this school year, before June 1, 2024, will be submitted to the Maine Department of Education, and you will not need to submit it separately. Starting next school year, the Department of Education will be asking for data in the School Health Annual Report, which is submitted by each school administrative unit through the school nurses. Finalized reporting questions for the 2023-24 school year will not be complete until August 2023, however, the current proposed concussion questions are listed below.

- What is the total number of concussions diagnosed by a provider?
- Of these, how many were injuries from:
 - Organized school-related athletic event
 - Other school-related injury (recess, PE, classroom)
 - Outside of school _____
